

## Students Cited As Future Leaders

(NAPSA)—As the worlds of business and politics change, so do the demands of leadership.

Due to shortages of welltrained leaders who can function effectively in complex, technologydriven environments and in varied cultural settings, new approaches are required to prepare young people for the demands of a changing world.

In an effort to promote the development of future global leaders, The Goldman Sachs Foundation has instituted a program that identifies 100 college students of exceptional promise.

Students applied from 54 institutions in Australia, Brazil, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, France, Germany, Hong Kong, Hungary, Japan, Mexico, Poland, South Africa, Spain, Sweden, the United Kingdom and the United States.

From the applicants, one hundred students were recognized as Goldman Sachs Global Leaders. The top fifty of these students were given the distinction of "top honors" and had the opportunity to participate in the Goldman Sachs Global Leaders Institute.

The program is managed by the same organization that manages the Fulbright program for the U.S. Department of State—the Institute of International Education.

Each of the 100 students selected as Global Leaders received an award of \$2,000. Besides attending the Global Leaders Institute, the 50 "top honors" students received an additional \$3,000 and a laptop computer.
