(NAPSA)—Leaders across America are talking about the recently elected chairman of America's Promise—The Alliance for Youth, former Senator Harris Wofford.



He played a key role in passing the trailblazing legislation that created AmeriCorps, the Learn and Serve America program and the Corporation for National and Community Service. He was also instrumental in organizing the Presidents' Summit.

"Harris has been with us from the very beginning. His chairmanship at America's Promise will be yet another milestone in his longstanding commitment to ensure that young people in this great country have every opportunity to lead successful lives," said General Colin L. Powell, Founding Chairman, America's Promise.

News of Senator Wofford's election to the Chairmanship of America's Promise drew comments from

leaders on both sides of the aisle. In the 1970s, Wofford was president of Bryn Mawr College. He is also the author of four books, including Of Kennedys and Kings: Making Sense of the Sixties.
