- Get references.
- Choose a National Air Duct Cleaners Association (NADCA) member.

ese contractors sign a Code of Ethics stating they will protect the confollow NADCA cleaning sumer and standards. To get and keep the certi cation, they must meet strict requirements and have a certi ed Air System Cleaning Specialist (ASCS) on sta who passed the NADCA certi cation examination, demonstrating extensive knowledge in HVAC design and cleaning.
